After diligent research and collaboration with available contractors, we hired "Ari-Thane Foam Products, Inc." to apply 1.5" of "Quick Shield" foam, and coat it with white Silicone. The decision has been made to address the most vulnerable area which constitutes approximately half of the total size of the flat roof. The cost of the project is \$39,889 plus permit fees. It comes with 10 year NO LEAK renewable warranty. I hope to find your consent of the necessity of this task and generous support of the project through your financial contributions. It is simply a common sense to keep our facility in order to benefit many generations, while we are preparing ourselves for the imminent coming of Christ. I hope that day is coming soon. In the mean time, stay connected with God, with your Church Family, with each other.


We have made our budget each month for July, August and September which means that all departments were funded. But we are still, at the end of September, \$6,287.63 short of the year to date total. Please keep church budget in your prayers along with putting money toward our church budget each. I want to thank each of you.

We have several accounts that are funded only by donations and <u>not the church budget</u>. Sabbath School Expense pays for all the Sabbath School Quarterlies, lesson papers for the younger departments, and teachers' materials. Adult Quarterlies are \$2.35 each. Children's S. S. Quarterlies are \$6.30 each. Lesson papers for the quarter average \$7.25 per child. The bill for all materials ran \$2,018.15 for 4th quarter. Your continuing support for Sabbath School expense is necessary.



INSIGHT INTO THE CROSS CONNECTION SERVICE AT YUCAIPA SDA CHURCH

Cross Connection is an alternative approach to worship that brings several different areas of focus together. While music is part of our worship service, the Cross Connection service is not entirely focused on offering only an alternative musical selection. Music in the Cross Connection service includes a very diverse selection each Sabbath; varying from praise music, to traditional hymns, to country gospel hymns, and can include spiritual hymns as well.

The centerpiece of worship at Cross Connection is the sermon, which can more accurately be described as the "Lesson" or the "Talk." The "talk" is approached from more of a classroom teaching experience, allowing interaction and questions throughout the service. These "talks" can also vary in subject matter from beginning Adventist doctrine to more in depth topics, such as the prophecies of Daniel and Revelation; the two books of the Bible that Ellen White recommends Seventh-day Adventists to pay particular attention to in these last days (TM 112, 113 {LDE 15.3}). Additionally, sermon "talks" have also included current issues in society as well as environmental changes and the degradation of the planet.

Contributing to the uniqueness of the Cross Connection service, as was mentioned above, is the "revolving microphone." This enables the congregation, including children, to be more involved in not only asking questions but also reading the quoted Bible Scriptures from the screen in the front of the sanctuary. Multimedia tools are used so as to engage visual learners and allows everyone to see what is being presented, both in writing and pictorially. Note-taking is encouraged and can be more easily taken with the use of these multimedia tools and notes can also be requested to be printed from the presenter.

It is the hope of the members of Cross Connection that this short description helps provide an overview of the focus, content and intent of the 7 Cross Connection worship service.

PRAYER MINISTRY CORNER

"But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober (vigilant), and watch unto prayer." (1 Peter 4:7) How do we apply this counsel to our everyday lives? I believe that all of us as Christians start each day by praying for God's leading and guidance. When particular difficulties or problems face us we pause and lift up our hearts to heaven praying for God's special direction and guidance. I now am beginning to better understand Peter's counsel to "watch unto prayer", Paul's advice to "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and, as Ellen White puts it, "live in an atmosphere of prayer"

Car rental companies seem to make a major insurance. portion of their profits on Consequently they will do anything to get one to use their insurance coverage. This past summer we had several occasions to rent cars from various agencies . Unhappily, one day we had a minor accident. When reversing on private property, we failed to see an old metal fence post that was projecting up at about a 20 degree angle from the ground which the right rear wheel hit causing the car to shoot forward to hit a rock on the other side doing considerable damage to the car. It wasn't until we arrived home and re-examined the documents that we realized that the insurance had not been put on our Visa card as we had intended which would have covered us with zero deductible. Not only that, we had in fact had paid excessively for the company's insurance- folly! Why do I relate this rather foolish incident?

As I reflected on it, although I'm sure we started the day asking for God's guidance, I don't recall asking God to guide when we walked up to the rental car desk. I am certain that had we done so God would have shown us the error, which would have saved considerable expense. 'ye have not because you ask not.'(James 4:2) As followers of Christ we should be connected moment by moment leaning on Him for wisdom and direction. How easy it is to just go ahead and do what seems reasonable to us without running it by the God of the universe who sees the big overall picture.

If car rental companies are out to catch who they can, what about Satan who seeking our souls has far more at stake. How we need to live in an atmosphere of prayer. The cost of insurance pales into insignificance beside the eternal implications of not submitting all our actions, even those we feel so comfortable with, to the guidance and direction of the One who freely offers to be our guide and counselor. This constant prayer is not something that comes naturally. I think of the expression "practicing the presence of Christ', which someone once told me was merely a platitude. In reality it is a growing experience and I pray that this incident will stay fresh in my mind as I learn to 'practice the presence of Christ' growing daily in my dependence upon Him.
