PASTOR'S NOTE

As the Christian Community around the World celebrates the event that reminds us about Jesus Christ's death and Resurrection, I would like to focus on another event that happened around the Passover time.

Remember the story from Acts 12: upset with the expansion of the Christian Movement, King Herod arrested some who belonged to the church, put to death James the brother of John and now seized Peter, and put him in prison. Sixteen of Rome's finest were assigned to keep an eye on an aging disciple. Luke tells us that "the church was earnestly praying to God for him."

In the middle of the night a brilliantly illuminated angel wakes up Peter, while the prison guards are sound asleep. The loud clang, the sound of the heavy chains and strong Roman handcuffs hitting the stone floor and the commotion that followed, didn't wake up comfortably sleeping guards. Peter follows the angel down the long hall, through the series of swinging open, steel gates.

As he finds himself outside, breathing the fresh night air, Peter is trying to decide, where to go. He heads for John Mark's home, where he is certain the church will be praying for him. And it is as he expected. Not everyone of us might experience similar conditions. Although, as an old Russian proverb says, "Being imprisoned and homeless, are the two things in life that should never be regarded as impossible."

The early church discovered that as personal prayer is the lifeblood of the Christians, corporate prayer is the lifeblood of the church. Someone likened individual prayer to a light, and corporate prayer to a laser. A single light illuminates a large place, but laser can drill a hole through steel. A Christian prayer takes hold of the arm of God. A group of Christians interceding together keeps the evil forces at a distance.

Jesus said, "If two of you on earth agree about anything you ask for, it will be done for you...." In times of need, will you have a place where you would know for sure your friends are praying for you? Find a person you can trust, someone you can open your heart to, who can be your prayer partner or a group that care to pray for each other. Be blessed as well as being a blessing to others!

Financial Report for 1st Quarter 2015

I HAVE GREAT NEWS. The roof debt has been paid off. Thank you to all of you who have participated in making the children's Sabbath School room roof a reality. Our children are important and to have classrooms that are safe and dry is wonderful. We raised \$40,000 in just 5 months.

This year has started a little short on donations for our church budget. We have been able to pay all our bills but have not had any funds for our ministries, such as Youth, Pathfinders, Adventurer Club, Sabbath School program materials, Family Ministries, Evangelism, Personal Ministries, VBS, Library, Church Nurture, etc. Our budget is \$14,000 each month. Your continuing support each month is needed.

This year we have a need for \$2,600 a month to help our young people attend our Adventist Schools. I am pleased to report that we have raised this money each month. Thank you for making our children a priority.

May God continue to bless you as you prayerfully support your church and its ministries.

ELDER CARE MUSIC MINISTRY

He changed our lives forever. We never knew his name. We never knew what became of him, but he changed our lives forever.

In 1990/1991, while members of the Mentone Seventh-day Adventist church, Trish and I joined forces with another couple (Mark and Cheryl) to take over the Mentone version of our Elder Care Music Ministry. Each month we would go to Heritage Gardens Assisted Living Center on Barton Road in Loma Linda (across from the V.A. Hospital) and present a 45-minute program of sing-along music and a short homily.

We had been doing this for several months when one day, just as were preparing to leave, the duty nurse for the Alzheimer's unit came up to us and said "We have a new patient who is completely unresponsive with Alzheimer's, could you please come to his room and play a song for him?" We readily agreed, and as we walked to his room, we chose a song from our songbook that we rarely used because it had 8 or 9 verses and wasn't a well-known song.

As we arrived at his room, we noticed the gentleman curled up on the settee in an almost fetal position, completely unaware of his surroundings. We looked questioningly at the nurse, and she just shrugged her shoulders as if to say "See, I told you so".

Gathering ourselves together, Mark and I started playing our guitars while Trish and Cheryl sang several verses of the song we had chosen. Focused on the song, we were shocked when suddenly, another male voice joined us at the correct verse! We hadn't noticed the gentleman get up off the settee and walk over to where we were singing!

We looked at each other in complete surprise, but kept playing and singing. While never once looking at us or our songbooks, that dear gentleman sang all of the remaining verses with us correctly from memory!

When we finally came to the end of the song, we stopped and nervously waited to see what would happen. Would he get upset? Would he become violent? Then, just as quietly as he had before, he turned around, walked over to the settee and curled up in the fetal position, completely unaware of us! Shocked, we turned to the nurse and she just stood

there, eyes wide and mouth agape, just as stunned as we were.

As we left the room, we all felt as though we were floating.... what a blessing we had just witnessed! God had used us and the music to reach that dear man, bringing him out of the "Alzheimer's darkness", and taking him to a place that was full of joy and the Word of God in song!

When had he learned that song? Why did he learn it? With whom did he sing it? We never did find out. Why had we chosen that particular song? The Holy Spirit chose it for us, just to reach that man!

On our way back to the car, it was abundantly clear that this was an important ministry and one that we must continue.

When Trish and I moved our membership to the Yucaipa Seventh-day Adventist Church, we started the Elder Care Music Ministry, visiting the Braswell's Hampton Manor on 4th Street (behind Stater Brother's Market) the first Sabbath of every month.

While we cannot say that you will experience a similar miracle, we can promise, that, if you choose to participate in this ministry, you will be a blessing to the dear residents of Hampton Manor.

Our program starts promptly at 3:00pm the 1st. Sabbath of each month. We have an eclectic mix of musical instruments, and singers and play/sing with the residents for about 30 minutes, after which we have a short homily, focusing on the merits of Jesus and the need to accept Him as their personal Saviour. We close with the song "The Savior is Waiting" and an invitational prayer.

YOUTH & YOUNG ADULT MINISTRIES

THE YOUTH HAS A COUNCIL

Drawing the definition from Wikipedia, a web-based, user-edited, encyclopedia, a lighthouse "...is a tower, building, or other type of structure designed to emit light from a system of lamps and lenses and used as a navigational aid for maritime pilots at sea or on inland waterways." What is even perhaps more important about this structure is that it "mark[s] dangerous coastlines, hazardous shoals, reefs, safe entries to harbors, and can also assist in aerial navigation."

Likewise, the youth of the church, must recognize the importance that they have in the direction of growth and life that our church takes. The Youth Council's organization is bring five representatives, a President, Religious VP, Social VP, Financial VP and Secretarial VP, that are youth aged, to work together much like a lighthouse has various mirrors to direct the light. The Youth Council's Purpose Statement states:

The Revive Youth Council serves the Yucaipa Seventh-day Adventist Church by provided a voice of the youth in the operations of the church administration and also planning events to maintain and grow the Yucaipa Seventh-day Adventist Church membership.

Ellen White, commenting on the necessity to allow the youth work inside the churches operations, states:

"Youthful talent, well organized and well trained, is needed in our churches. The youth will do something with their overflowing energies. Unless these energies are directed into right channels, they will be used by the youth in a way that will hurt their own spirituality, and prove an injury to those with whom they associate." ¹

Therefore it is absolutely necessary that the church continue to support and encourage our Youth Council as they move forward, under the guidance of Elder Dave Larson and myself, Pastor Jamison Wallington, making decisions and planning events to lead to the growth of God's kingdom. If we fail to support the children and youth of our churches, we can be assured that they will fade into non-operational use status, much like what is happening with many lighthouses, while they "Once [were] widely used, the number of operational lighthouses has declined due to the expense of maintenance and replacement by modern electronic navigational systems such as strobes."
