You are welcome to bring your sack lunch and eat outside or buy food inside. Parking is across from the museum. You must sign up in foyer or call the church office by Monday, Oct. 7 with all money at the church by Oct. 8. Carpools will be available for Seniors. Please sign up for them. Cost for Seniors is \$13.95, for adults \$16.95 and for children 3 - 11 \$9.95 if we have 10 people that go.

Experts estimate that as much as 95 percent of the volume of the <u>World Ocean</u> and 99 percent of its seafloor remain unexplored. You will want to see this new exhibit.
