## *Three Angels Calling*



“In a special sense Seventh-day Adventists have been set in the world as watchmen and light bearers. To them has been entrusted the last warning for a perishing world. ## LLU's 2<sup>nd</sup> Film Festival: The Unabashedly Religious Movie

*Jesus of Montreal (R)*, Friday night, **January 30**, 7:00-10:30

*Chocolat (PG-13)*, Sabbath, 10:30-1:30

*Noah (PG-13)*, Sabbath 3:00-6:00

*Central Station (R)*, Saturday night, 8:00-10:15

These unabashedly religious films have strengths and weaknesses—both cinematically and theologically. Reflect critically on 4 films at the intersection of religion and popular culture.

Film critic and theologian Ron Jolliffe will lead a workshop-style analysis, following each screening.

What is a *religious movie*?

To select films for a festival called “The Unabashedly Religious Movie,” one asks what seems at first an obviously simple question: What is a “religious movie”? The answer is elusive. A variety of approaches come to mind:

Content: Does the movie have to have religion as its subject matter: a film of a church service perhaps? Does it need to substantiate a doctrine through narrative? Does it need to be a biopic of a religious leader? Should it dramatize a religious text?

Absence of Content: Does it become religious because of what it does not contain? No swearing, no sex, no violence, no bad music, no depictions of sin? Do movie ratings G, PG, PG-13, R, NC-17 represent degrees of religiousness?

Maker: Perhaps it is not content, but who produced the movie that determines whether or not it is a religious movie. If a religious denomination makes a movie, does that make the movie, *ipso facto*, a religious movie? Does it depend on the faith of the director or the actors? If the cast and crew are secular, does it make the movie secular?

Reception: The question can also be framed by the reception of the movie: Is it reviewed favorably by religious publications? Does a positive *Christianity Today* review make a movie religious?

Advocacy: Does the movie have to assume God is real to be a religious movie? Must it advocate for a cause that religious people care about: pro-life/choice, school prayer, capital punishment, equal time in science classes for creationist views? What if the movie presents a doctrine important to some major faith community, but some viewers find the doctrine reprehensible: is it a religious movie?

What organizing principle guides this year's Film Festival selections?

The films are chosen to reflect illustrative answers to the question above: What is a religious movie? The four movies can be categorized as a parable (*Jesus of Montreal*), a contemporary reflection on temptation and resistance (*Chocolat*), a dramatization of a Bible story (*Noah*), and an exploration of ethics (*Central Station*).

Why should there be film festivals at Loma Linda University? Because screens have become the primary narrative vehicle in the contemporary world, and because there are significant differences between a written narrative and a visualized narrative, we must not only understand what is on screen, but how what is on screen works on people. In what ways does screen narrative differ from text narrative?
