

Cross Country, under the direction of Robert and Juli Simmons, is already practicing for fall meets this year. Look at them lined up and ready to go in last year's picture.



Back-to-School nights happened on three separate evenings this past week for primary grades, middle grades, and high school. Parents have the opportunity to chat with teachers, see the classrooms, learn about school programs, and meet other parents. At the moment we have approximately 245 students: grades K-8 enrollment is at 151, and grades 9-12 total around 90 students. We ask that you keep us in your prayers as God leads us in the **big, BIG plans** that He has for us this year.
