

The focus of our accrediting organizations, WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) and AAA (Adventist Accrediting Association), is student learning. Their endorsement is one way to know that any given school is providing a good curriculum and environment for students. This April, Mesa Grande Academy will go through the accreditation process once again. The school has gathered information for the accreditation team through focus groups that are comprised of teachers, students, parents, and school board members. This information is distilled into an approximately 200 page report that seven members of a visiting WASC team will read before they come to our campus for a visit from April 24-27. This team also helps MGA decide its goals for the next six years.

The school is guided by our mission statement and our SISRs. Our mission statement reads: "Mesa Grande will train its students to make the most of their God-given potential and develop a Commitment to His excellence by becoming spiritual seekers, inquiring scholars, skilled communicators and responsible citizens." Those four categories within the mission statement become our student learning goals, which we call SISRs, an acronym unique to our school.

Spiritual Seekers:

Grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ and His people. Recognize and utilize their God-given talents in their life choices. Demonstrate a knowledge of Biblical principles and the mission of the SDA church.

Inquiring Scholars:

Use resources and develop study skills necessary for success in life. Think critically, communicate effectively, and demonstrate competency in all subject areas. Develop the skills and curiosity to continue learning outside their classroom.

Skilled Communicators:

Listen effectively and work cooperatively as leaders and team members. Express themselves in language, visual and performing arts. Treat others and their ideas with respect, compassion and understanding.

Responsible Citizens:

Serve their local and global communities.

Understand the benefits of living a healthy, balanced lifestyle.

Exhibit self-discipline and a Christ-like character.

The subcategories for each goal are written in child-friendly and ageappropriate language. What you just read was for grades 9-12; however, they are also written separately for grades K-4 and grades 5-8.

The report that we mail to the committee members consists of five chapters. Chapter 1 is information about the demographics of our school, test score results, charts and graphs, etc. Chapter 2 contains our mission and values statements, and outlines our student learning outcomes (SISRs). Chapter 3 gives progress reports for every year since our last visit in 2010, and lists yearly accomplishments toward what that committee outlined for us to do. Chapter 4 is the heart of the document, on which we utilized focus groups, outlining four self-study areas: A) organization for student learning; B) curriculum, instruction, and assessment; C) support for student personal, academic, and spiritual growth; D) resource management and development. Chapter 5 outlines our action plans or strategies for areas in which we would like to improve.


In Chapter 4, we are able to list valuable things that the school is providing in order to analyze how well we are accomplishing what we say we are doing, and to elucidate perceived strengths and weaknesses. Chapter 5 is an outgrowth of Chapter 4. When we see things we wish to improve, those often become an Action Plan. We have composed three action plans for this report:

SCHOOL-WIDE ACTION PLAN 1: The administration and K-12 faculty need to develop an organized, formal system for measuring the SISRs and evaluating student learning (toward tracking levels of student achievement and growth against the SISRs.)

SCHOOL-WIDE ACTION PLAN #2: Implement an annual process of surveying students, parents, alumni and staff with the goal of using feedback to improve student learning.

SCHOOL-WIDE ACTION PLAN #3: The K-8 faculty will examine and revise writing curriculum to strengthen the writing program at Mesa Grande Academy.

At the end of their visit, the committee will assign a length of time, anywhere from one to six years, for our reaccreditation. Thank you again for your prayers and support. We do solicit your continued prayers as we look forward to our WASC evaluation. We believe there are many wonderful things happening under the direction of the Holy Spirit on our campus. We want our visiting committee to see the power of God as they spend time with us. Like Jabez in the Bible, MGA's prayer is: "Oh that You would bless me indeed and enlarge my border, and that Your hand might be with me!" (1 Chronicles 4:10)
