Dr. Yuri Bondarenko, Director Kiev Christian Medical Center will be here to speak about The KAMC which is now complete on the exterior and within 5% finished interior and contains approx. 40,000 sq ft interior space. As-built floor plans are not yet available, but, among a large variety of operations and activities therein; occur many health activities and community health services family focused, also, ADRA for the ESD, with special focus on delivering the humanitarian from the US and Canada, counseling-PTSD and addictions, and AWR broadcasting studios for the ESD, plus health foods and books sales. 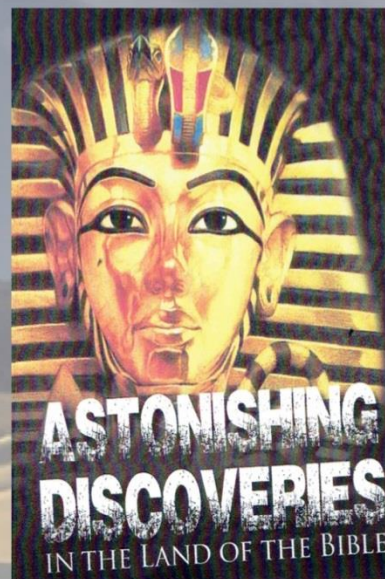
At the time of writing the epistle, Paul was about to return to Palestine, bearing from the churches in Macedonia and Achaia a contribution for the poor among the Christians in Jerusalem. He intended, after completing this mission, to visit Rome, and from there travel on to Spain. As yet he had never been able to visit the Christian church in the capital city of the Roman Empire, though he had often desired to do so. But now he believed that he had completed his missionary labor in Asia and Greece, and was eager to move westward to strengthen the work in Italy and to introduce Christianity to Spain.

We will enjoy a thorough exposition of Paul's marvelous letter to the Romans and to us **every Sabbath afternoon starting, by popular demand, one hour before sunset**, preceded by a short period of Q & A from the sermon this morning.

This is a great way to close the Sabbath, to spring into a new week, and to learn the words of God. AND this is a great place to invite friends to learn what the Bible teaches about nearly every major question in life. That's how thorough the Book of Romans is.

Elder Strunk will be leading most of the studies. Study begins at 6:38 p.m. and ends at 7:38p.m. Come early to get a good seat.

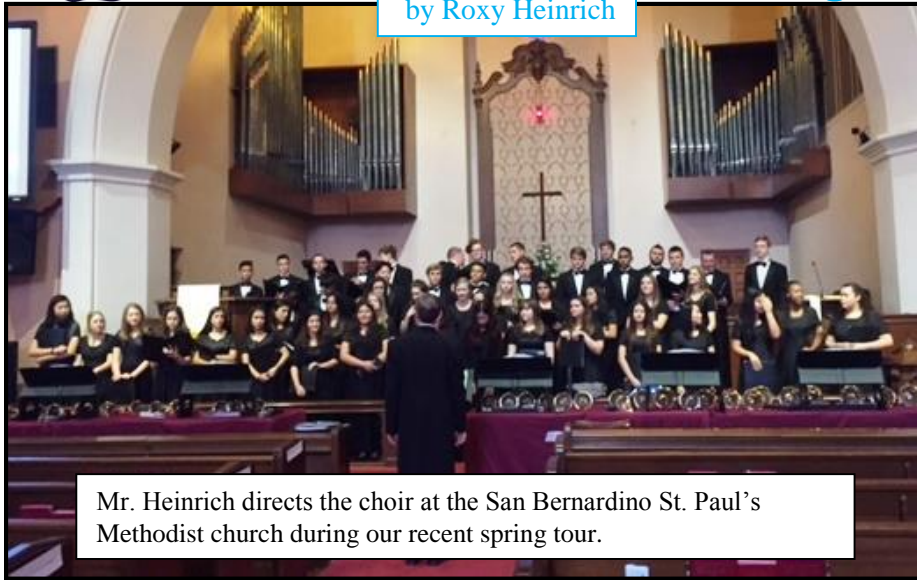

With a short warm-up, the vocal choir is ready. Two sets of five-octave handbells are set in proper order on numerous tables and the service is underway with two magnificent songs of flashing brass bells.

When the service is ending, the full choir of 70 silently takes the Chancel steps and provides a passionate postlude.

Then in a cadence without many words, the bells are back in their rolling cases, the tables are down and walking out of the Sanctuary and the youth are heading to the Fellowship Hall for refreshment and a change into street clothes for the next part of their 4-day journey.

This is the music program of Mesa Grande Academy, a Seventh Day Adventist private school providing not only a strong education with music as a key ingredient, but also is leading this batch of youth into a lifestyle of grace and excellence.

Thanks to Lidiya (their minister of music who also teaches private piano lessons at MGA) for orchestrating this music feast and sincere thanks to Mesa Grande for showing us there are youth doing wonderful things in today's confusing world.

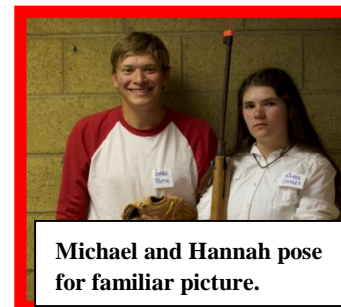
