

Bible Commentary Genesis 2:7

A living soul. When the lifeless form of man was infused with this divine "breath." neshamah, of life, man became a living "soul," nephesh. The word nephesh has a variety of meanings: (1) breath (Job 41:21), (2) life (1 Kings 17:21; 2 Sam. 18:13; etc.), (3) heart as the seat of affections (Gen. 34:3; S. of Sol. 1:7; etc.), (4) living being (Gen. 12:5; 36:6; Lev. 4:2; etc.), and (5) for emphasizing the personal pronouns (Ps. 3:2; 1 Sam. 18:1; etc.). Note that the nephesh is made by God (Jer. 38:16), and can die (Judges 16:30), be killed (Num. 31:19), be eaten (metaphorically, Eze. 22:25), be redeemed (Ps. 34:22), and be refreshed (Ps. 19:7, Heb.). None of this applies to the spirit, ruach, indicating clearly the great difference between the two terms. It is obvious from the above survey that the translation "soul" given by the KJV to the *nephesh* of ch. 2:7 is not appropriate, if the commonly used expression "immortal soul" be implied. Although popular, this concept is completely foreign to the Bible. This passage may rightly be translated: "Man became a living being" (RSV). When "soul" is considered synonymous with "being," we gain the Scriptural meaning of *nephesh* in this text.

Spirit. [Heb. and Aramaic ruach, "breath," "wind," "vital element," "mind"; Gr. pneuma, "breath," "wind," "spirit."] The divine energy, or life principle, that animates human beings. Whereas the Hebrew word nephesh, "soul," denotes individuality, or personality (see Soul), ruach, "spirit," refers to the energizing spark of life essential to individual existence. Růach occurs 377 times in the OT, and most frequently is translated "spirit," "wind," or "breath" (Gen 8:1; etc.). It is also used to denote vitality (Jgs 15:19), courage (Jos 2:11), temper or anger (Jgs 8:3), disposition (Is 54:6), moral character (Eze 11:19), and the seat of the emotions (1 Sa 1:15). In the sense of breath, the *rûach* of men is identical with the růach of animals (Ec 3:19). The rûach of man leaves the body at death (Ps 146:4) and returns to God (Ec 12:7; cf. Job 34:14). Rúach is used frequently of the Spirit of God, as in Is 63:10. Never in the OT, with respect to man, does rûach denote an intelligent entity capable of sentient existence apart from a physical body.

The NT equivalent of rûach is pneuma, "spirit," from pneo, "to blow." or "to breathe." As with ruach, there is nothing inherent in the word pneuma denoting an entity in man capable of conscious existence apart from the body, nor does NT usage with respect to man in any way imply such a concept. In such passages as Rom 8:15; 1 Cor 4:21; 2 Ti 1:7; 1 In 4:6 pneuma denotes "mood," "attitude," or "state of feeling." It is also used of various aspects of the personality, as in Gal 6:1; Rom 12:11; etc. As with ruach, the pneuma is yielded to the Lord at death (Lk 23:46; Acts 7:59). Like rûach, pneuma is also used of the Spirit of God (1 Cor 2:11, 14; Eph 4:30; Heb 2:4; 1 Pe 1:12; 2 Pe 1:21; etc.).


Soul. [Heb. generally nephesh, "breath," "life," "person," "emotions," "appetites," from naphash, "to breathe"; Gr. psuche, "breath," "life," "life principle," "living creature," "person," "the affections," "the feelings." The terms thus translated have a variety of meanings. In its first occurrence (Gen 2:7), the Heb. nephesh denotes man, who was given existence when the divine spark of life was injected into a physical body formed from the dust of the ground. Similarly, a new soul comes into existence whenever a child is born, each "soul" being a new unit of life uniquely different, and separate, from other similar units. This quality of individuality in each living being, which constitutes it a unique entity, seems to be the idea emphasized by the Hebrew term nephesh. When used in this sense nephesh is not a part of the person; it is the person, and, in many instances, is translated "person" (see Gen 14:21; Num 5:6; Deut 10:22; cf. Ps 3:2) or "self" (Lev 11:43; 1 Ki 19:4; Is 46:2; etc.). On the other hand, expressions such as "my soul," "your soul," "his soul," etc., are generally idioms for the personal pronouns "I," "me," "you," "he," etc. (see Gen 12:13; Lev 11: 43, 44; 19:8; Jos 23:11; Ps 3:2; Jer 37:9; etc.). In more than 100 of 755 occurrences in the OT the KJV translates nephesh as "life" (Gen 9:4, 5; 1 Sa 19:5; Job 2:4, 6; Ps 31:13; etc.). Often nephesh refers to desires, appetites, or passions (cf. Deut 23:24; Prov 23:2; Ec 6:7), and is sometimes translated "appetite" (Prov 23:2; Ec 6:7). It may refer to the seat of the affections (Gen 34:3; Song 1:7; etc.), and at times it represents the volitional part

of man, as when translated "pleasure" (KJV) in Deut 23:24; Ps 105:22; Jer 34: 16. In Num 31:19 the *nephesh* (translated "person") is "killed," and in Jgs 16:30 (translated "me") it dies. In Num 5:2 ("the dead") and ch 9:6 ("dead body") it refers to a corpse (cf. Lev 19:28; Num 9:7, 10).

The usage of the Greek word $psuch \ddot{e}$ in the NT is similar to that of *nephesh* in the OT. It is used of animal life as well as human life (Rev 16:3). In the KJV it is translated 40 times simply as "life" or "lives" (see Mt 2:20; 6:25; 16:25; etc.). In some instances it is used to mean simply "people" (see Acts 7:14; 27:37; Rom 13:1; I Pe 3:20; etc.), and in others it is equivalent to the personal pronoun (see Mt 12:18; 2 Cor 12:15; etc.). Sometimes it refers to the emotions (Mk 14:34; Lk 2:35), to the mind (Acts 14:2; Php 1:27), or to the heart (Eph 6:6).

The idea that a "soul" can have sentient existence apart from the body, or that it possesses an immortal essence, is wholly foreign to the Bible. This nonscriptural idea originated in the ancient pagan religious and philosophical systems of Greece and Egypt, and finds no support in the inspired writings. There is nothing in the words translated "soul" or in their usage in the Bible that even remotely implies a conscious entity that survives the body after death, or that attributes immortality to it. In fact, the NT specifically teaches that the soul (*psuchē*) is destroyed along with the body in "hell" (Mt 10:28).
