Rome was the capitol of the empire. Whatever happened in the church and to the church at Rome affected churches throughout the empire. For example the church at Rome was made up largely of Gentile converts who had formerly been sun worshipers. So it was easier for them to adopt Sunday as a day of celebration in place of Saturday which was a day of ill omen according to Astrology which was also strong in Rome. And it helped them avoid being viewed as Jews who were hated by many.

Therefore the letter to the Romans, the Roman believers, became a major treatise with the potential of affecting all Christian churches. And so it has. But it has been misinterpreted by those who want to misinterpret it. Our task is to interpret it more accurately. And so we do every Sabbath evening one hour before sunset. Be sure you're in the pews to close the Sabbath in worship with music, with Bible study, and with sharing with serious students of Scripture

Emmanuel Gonzalez and Luke Hagelgantz, two seniors, have auditioned and been chosen for singing positions as basses in the La Sierra University Choir tour that is going to Japan this summer. Director, Ariel Quintana, was introduced to these talented men when MGA sang in a mass choir that performed at Loma Linda Church earlier this spring. Two of Quintana's singers had to drop out at the last moment, so he called Mr. Heinrich and arranged for these two auditions. La Sierra University is awarding \$3,500.00 scholarships to each to enable them to raise the funds to participate. They will be learning the music with Mr. Heinrich before their departure for three weeks in July.

Roxy Heinrich was selected as one of nine local middle and high school Teachers of Excellence by the local LDS church. Students from the LDS churches nominated and wrote essays concerning teachers they felt should be honored. Shawna Echols, a junior at MGA, nominated Mrs. Heinrich. Teachers were chosen from Yucaipa High School, San Geronio Middle School, Mesa View Middle School, and Mesa Grande Academy. A ceremony was held on May 20, and one of the inspiring comments made by Daryl Cartozian, Yucaipa LDS Stake President was, "They (teachers) truly make a difference in the lives of our youth. We are so very grateful for the talents they share with us and their dedication to the students. They are certainly leaders in this community and take their power to influence and inspire our youth very seriously. ... They are like candles who consume themselves giving light to others."

MGA, chosen from all the SECC school sites, will be involved in an exciting new program. The conference has decided to fund a pilot program for three years involving an instructional coach that will provide support, ideas, and demonstrations for teachers. The coach will spend about 30-60 minutes per week with each teacher individually and visit classrooms, as well as come to faculty meetings to inspire teachers in the very best educational practices.

What is the rationale behind this marvelous innovation? The church is looking for ways to make Adventist education more viable in the following areas: curriculum delivery, common core and standards-based curriculum, and RenWeb electronic feedback and grades. Public schools are commonly involved utilizing this support system, and Adventists desire to be at the very top in service to our students.

This concept has been piloted in the SDA system in Beltsville, Maryland with fantastic results. California wanted to duplicate the school parameters as closely as possible—a school with 15-20 teachers, relatively close to the conference office and centrally based in the conference-wide area, with no multi-grade classrooms. Mr. Riddle interviewed at the conference office this week to establish our school as the candidate. He also interviewed with the coach, who begins July 1 and will be spending part of the summer in Beltsville. She will maintain an office at both the SECC and MGA announced educational superintendent, Rob Smith.

The goals for curriculum coaching dovetail perfectly with one of the WASC goals that our faculty, board, and focus groups set out this spring—to develop an across-the-curriculum, school-wide writing program that uses the same terms and types of grading rubrics throughout the years to strengthen written expression.

Enthusiastic, excited, and exhilarated describe the teachers and administration at MGA as we look forward to starting next school year with our new coach on board!

Legislative Alert

SB 1146 – Oppose

SB 1146 amends the California Education Code to eliminate any meaningful protection for religious colleges and universities to integrate faith into all aspects of campus life. It does so by applying broad anti-discrimination laws, including religious discrimination laws. Religious colleges may no longer be able to require faculty and students to uphold basic religious values. While the bill is vague it appears that employment decisions could not be based on religion, except for those teaching theology and religion.

SB 1146 also clarifies that there is a “private right of action,” i.e., the right to sue religious colleges and obtain not only damages, but injunctive relief. This means a court can order a religious school to hire unbelievers, to stop requiring students to attend worship, to stop requiring religion classes for students who object, etc.

This bill represents a threat to religious colleges and universities, many of which will be forced either to secularize or to shutter.

All you need say or write is your name, city that you live in and that you are calling/writing to oppose SB 1146. Usually you will not be asked to give an explanation but it is wise to know the reasons.
