How many does the heavenly sanctuary have? We will enter that debate. What are the differences between the earthly and heavenly sanctuaries? How many "rests" are there in Hebrews? Can you be a priest in the heavenly sanctuary? We meet one hour before sunset in the sanctuary preceded by 15 minutes of live music. This is a refreshing way to close the Sabbath. Sunset is 6:14 p.m., so our study begins at 5:14.
